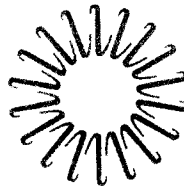

Dear Applicant:

This letter is in response to your inquiry about a fellowship position in General Academic Pediatrics at Brown University School of Medicine and Rhode Island Hospital/Hasbro Children's Hospital. The fellowship position here provides a background in fundamental research principles, biostatistics, and clinical epidemiology with both didactic and practical experience. In addition, it provides experience in teaching and consulting responsibilities with regard to the Brown University students and residents in pediatrics. There is also a component of direct and autonomous patient care.

The fellowship is quite flexible and is designed to meet the educational needs of the individual participant. For example, several fellows have elected to pursue interests in adolescent medicine and one of our previous fellows has remained with us as director of a teen-tot clinic. Others had interest in behavioral/developmental pediatrics and their research has been focused in this area.

At the present time, we have six academic generalists all of whom either have PhDs or further subspecialty training in general academic pediatrics, behavioral/developmental pediatrics, child psychiatry, and public health. Every major pediatric specialty is represented in the Department of Pediatrics and fellows from all of the pediatric specialties participate in a core curriculum on research training sponsored by the Department. As well, there would be opportunities to take additional course work on the Brown University campus as some of our previous fellows have opted to do.

The State of Rhode Island is the smallest state in the Union yet boasts some of the most beautiful coastline and nautical recreational activities in the United States. We are within an one hour drive to Boston and a three hour drive to New York City. Rhode Island has a temperate climate and four distinct seasons.

I have enclosed formal fellowship application materials and information about our program and our hospital. Thank you for your interest in our program.
