PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This year's program will include nationally recognized speakers as well as interactive sessions for CRNA's and Anesthesiologist's.

This activity will also stress the importance of communication and shared knowledge among surgical and medical subspecialties in the care of the critically ill patient. Topics covered during the conference include Updates to the Surviving Sepsis Campaign (SSC) Guidelines; fluid management, antibiotic administration and hemodynamic monitoring of the critically ill patient; anesthetic implications and management of the trauma patient that requires operative intervention; and current trends in the resuscitation of the trauma patient.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Identify, diagnose and manage critically ill patients who arrive to the operating room with a working diagnosis of sepsis
- Determine timing of antibiotic administration and approach to fluid management in septic shock

- Recognize the importance of damage-control resuscitation (DCR) and management of the trauma patient undergoing DCR
